





Minister's letter

The news on the climate front is not good. A heat wave in India has wiped out 50% of that country's wheat harvest. The world's top climate scientists are warning that such occurrences are on the point of becoming commonplace unless there are immediate and sustained reductions in carbon emissions across the whole planet. As I am writing this, there is a stand off between the United Nations and Russia about releasing the considerable stocks of grain held in Ukraine. Unless this is resolved soon, it will be disastrous for hundreds of thousand of people around the world who depend on UN food aid for survival. We could see more people dying of starvation next year than died of COVID last year.

Even in this country price increases for food and fuel are impacting the poorest in our society, for whom necessities make up a much bigger proportion of their expenditure. They are not in a position to do without a second holiday in order to afford to fill up the oil tank, or delay replacing the second car to continue to buy their favourite groceries. They can't afford even one holiday, and if they have a car, it is a necessity to get to work, and only replaced when it falls to pieces.

One hopes that action will be taken in this country to share the burden of these price increases more fairly, and we pray that the UN is supported by its members to mitigate world hunger. Is it too much to hope that price increases will encourage those who paid no attention to exhortation to cut down on their energy use and their waste of food? Let us not despair too much over the big picture we can do nothing about, and instead concentrate on the small things each of us can do to make a difference.

This magazine's distribution will be about the same time as the long weekend to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Do enjoy yourself; in an environmentally safe fashion, of course.

Going Green Gracefully No. 19

“The greatest threat to the planet is the belief that someone else will save it”
Beware of Greenwashing. Lots of clothing manufacturers are trying to persuade us that buying clothes made from natural fibres like hemp and linen is kinder to the planet. Only up to a point! It has now been discovered that even natural textiles shed microfibres when they are washed. These will eventually decay (they are biodegradable) but until they do, just like the more persistent plastic fibres from man-made fabrics, no one is quite sure what effect they will have on the environment. ‘Organic cotton’ sounds fine, but it still needs huge amounts of water to grow it.

The problem with clothes is far too many are produced, worn a few times and then discarded. I’ve read that over 70% end up in landfill. That is scandalous. Think before you buy new clothes. What is needed is more re-use, re-purposing and re-sale. Just recently the Kirkgate Centre in Cockermonth held a two day event at which ladies could sell clothes for which they had no further use, and/or snap up quality garments at bargain prices. It was called COCKFROCK. If I can think of a suitable name, I’ll suggest they try a similar event for gentlemen’s fashions.

The real innovation in environmentally friendly clothing is the fully recyclable garment, which some manufacturers are starting to produce. When it wears out, any metal parts can easily be separated from the fabric, so it can be returned to the manufacturer for recycling. In the future we may need legislation so that all clothes are like that, and none of them go to landfill.

Reduce, reuse and refill on the go. Refill is a free app that locates your nearest refill station to help you eat, drink and shop with less waste. There are 300,000+ Refill stations on the map including water bottle refill stations and local zero-waste food shops. Download the app from <https://www.refill.org.uk/about/> and have a go at using it when you’re out and about!

Meeting – Tuesday 17th May 2022. Apologies from Sarah Sharpe, meeting chaired by vice chairman Ric Outhwaite.

At the recent AGM a new chair was elected, Sarah Sharpe so we welcome her to her new role. We must also thank and acknowledge the work of the outgoing chair, Daniel Young who remains on the council.

There was an ongoing debate as to what Forestry England might be planning for our valley and how that might impact on the qualities of the valley and the livelihoods of those who live and work there.

Issues were raised regarding the impact of “staycation” fly campers with activity around Bowness Knott getting particular mention. The matter is to be pursued with the authorities. If anyone has examples of similar unacceptable behaviour do let the landowners and Parish council know.

4. Reviewed was the correspondence to 18th May 2022, Lake District National Park, request from of parishes to become members of the group. West Cumberland Hospital Services requesting support for improved services at WC Hospital stroke and heart care units, all agreed to supporting this campaign, the clerk to contact them.
4.3 Wild Ennerdale Beaver Project Development, the LPC support the point made in the letter received from Ghyll Farm regarding the proposed development and its lack of consultation. NALC Views and Services,

All agreed it to be a true record and the Chair signed, clerk to forward to external audit.

6. Member of Public said of the Wild Ennerdale Beaver Project Development that the letter received from Ghyll Farm was 100% correct as he too was an attendee of the same public meeting held at St Mary's Church on 14 April 2022. The Forestry England representative was unaware of the strength of the local feelings and unease. The impact on Low Gillerthwaite Field Centre, increased Ecotourism, potential flood risk and the charging at car parks or the closing of car parks was a disaster. With no distinct Chair the meeting rapidly became chaotic as people were becoming frustrated as they were not getting the answers to their questions. People want to know if Low Gillerthwaite Field Centre will be redeveloped as an Eco-tourism centre. Will Car Parking charges be introduced at all car parks? That would result in more parking on verges and requiring double yellow lines throughout the valley. Increased visitor numbers will require double yellow lines throughout Ennerdale Bridge. Up to 100,000 visitors could be the increase seen. The person responsible for developing Whinlatter has been given the responsibility of developing Eco Tourism in Wild Ennerdale. Toilets and café are to be developed at Bowness Knott. Clerk to prepare a letter to all parties concerned with this development and to send to councillors to add their thoughts. The letter will then be posted out to all parties.
7. Planning applications received.
4/21/2188/0F1 - 3 May 2022 - Consultation on Additional and Amended Information: Change of use from an agricultural shed to a milk distribution facility and agricultural storage shed (retrospective). Land to the South of Whinnah Cottages, Lamplugh.

When is Trooping the Colour?

The Queen's Birthday Parade, known as Trooping the Colour, takes place on Thursday, 2 June and will bring together more than 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians.

The parade, which will be broadcast live on television, will start at Buckingham Palace, then move down The Mall to Horse Guards Parade, joined by members of the Royal Family on horseback and in carriages.

It will close with a six-minute flypast of more than 70 aircraft from the Royal Navy, the Army and Royal Air Force, watching by the Queen and members of the Royal Family from the Buckingham Palace balcony.
