

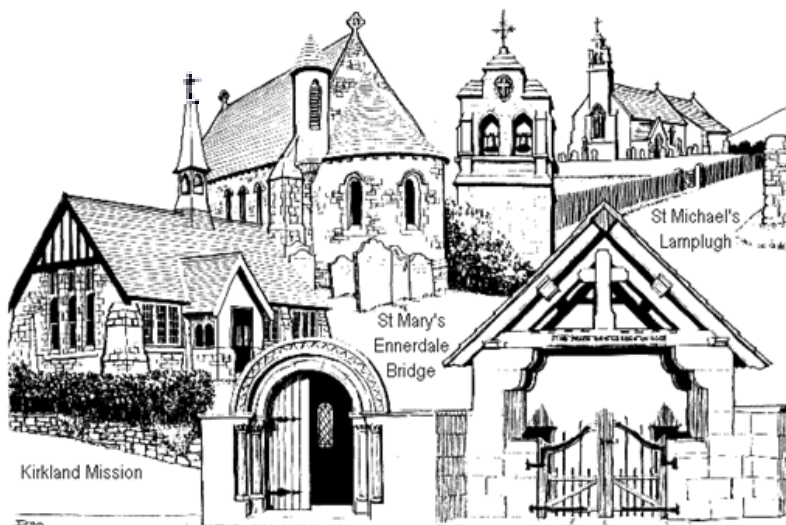

Minister's letter

Most people are aware of their local church as a building, and in a small community like this one may well know their local clergy and some of the people who make up the local congregation. They may also be aware of the church as a national organisation, when events like the Platinum Jubilee service are televised or when Bishops comment adversely on government policy. But it is less well known what goes on at an intermediate level.

I recently attended the AGM of Churches Together in Cumbria which brings together all of the main Christian denominations in our county. Most of the roles in this organisation are filled by people alongside their day job, but it does employ a social responsibility officer, Jo Phillips. A lot of her work in the last year has been addressing the thorny problem of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, providing a link between Cumbria Constabulary and other organisations in the county as try to improve partnership working and learn from other areas of Britain where partnerships to help victims are more firmly established. She has also had a hand in resourcing churches to become more environmentally aware as Eco-church becomes mainstream. Other topics covered in her report include Adoption & Fostering, Agriculture & Rural Affairs, Asylum Seekers, Bereavement, Domestic Abuse, Housing & Homelessness and Mental Health.

Local congregations, especially small ones, can pray about these issues but often lack the opportunity or resources to become directly involved. It is good to know that people are working at county level in the name of the church to make a difference.

Going Green Gracefully No. 20

The publication of this edition of *Contact* coincides with Wimbledon. Traditionally spectators eat strawberries and cream, because this event is held at the time when strawberries are in season. For similar reasons we eat Brussels sprouts at Christmas. Many fruits and vegetables are now available all the year round, but it is always good to **Eat Seasonally**. Here are five reasons:

1. The Carbon Output

Eating local, seasonal fruits and vegetables reduces the demand for out of season produce – minimizing the strain on resources for transportation of such goods.

2. The Price

When produce is grown in artificial, managed conditions in your own country, or transported from another where it grows naturally, this costs money – which is passed on to the consumer.

3. The Taste

Spending days or weeks squashed up in shipping containers can cause produce to spoil, and takes away the freshness that local, seasonally-grown produce offers.

4. The Local Farmers

The globalized food distribution system often forces farmers to join large-scale enterprises to survive. Small-scale, local farmers rely on more natural methods, such as organic practices that benefit crop, land and people – which it's so important to support! Eating seasonally also helps farmers through their leanest time of year, winter.

5. The Variety

When you eat seasonally, you're forced to think outside the box and try produce and recipes you might not have ordinarily opted for. You'll have plenty of variation in your diet – and you'll soon find yourself looking forward to the next season for your next dose of different produce.

LAMPLUGH VILLAGE HALL

News

Good progress continues to be made with the construction of the new hall. Plastering of the walls has been completed and internal decoration is underway along with the fitting of the kitchen, bar and toilets. It is hoped that the building will be finished at some stage in July.

However there, unfortunately, will be a delay in the opening of the new hall until at least September 2022 and possibly later. The new hall has, of course, to be connected to the electricity supply. In March, after a site meeting earlier in the year, Electricity North West (ENW) provided a revised quote for this connection in excess of £10,000 (inclusive of VAT) which was accepted by the committee and promptly paid.

Since that payment our lead consultant, Ed Bushell, has been in very regular contact with ENW to organise a date for the connection work to be completed. At the end of May, Ed was informed by a representative of ENW that the earliest date for connection would be in August 2022.. The committee hopes that the connection will be completed by the September edition of Contact..

While the new hall is being built alternative venues will be made available to regular and other users of the village hall. Please contact Mark Stevens whose details are listed below to arrange alternative facilities.

LAMPLUGH
THE CHURCH OF ST MICHAEL'S
*(written in an article/book in about 1910 by Caesar Caine
priest at Cleator)*

Lamplugh is a very scattered parish and includes several hamlets – Kelton, Kirkland, Murton and Winder. In Murton is “Lamplugh Cross”. In 1811 the whole area contained one hundred houses and about 532 inhabitants. The population increased due to the mining industry. Near Stookhow Hall there is locally known the “Standing Stones”. The name is indicative of the site of a Druid Temple and carries us back to the time of the ancient Britons. The district is not without memories of the days of the Romans for the Roman road from Egremont to Papcastle ran through Lamplugh. The name Lamplugh is said to be a survival of the presence of the Celts. There is no doubt that the Parish Church stood originally at Kirkland and the present chancel of the parish church close to the old hall was a private chapel of the Lamplugh family. The name Kirkland (Churchland) is in favour of a church standing here in ancient days.

Every vestige of an early church at Kirkland has been swept away but a mission church has been erected there for the newcomers to the district.

The chapel of the Lamplughs is now the parish church and is dedicated to St Michael. It was restored in 1870 and accommodates nearly 300 people.

The value of the benefice was about nine pounds. The chief point of interest in the church of St Michael's today is the extremely beautiful picture glass which fills the windows. No church in the deanery is quite so rich in this respect

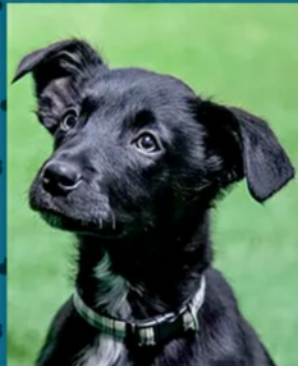
