Minister's letter

When I started writing this article, it was not clear who would be Prime Minister or Chancellor of the Exchequer by the time you came to read it. As I complete it Mr Sunak is about to become PM and it still seems likely that on October 31 we will have a budget statement outlining a way forward for the country's finances in the difficult situation in which we find ourselves.

Amid all the political confusion of mid October, a letter was sent to the Chancellor of the Exchequer from a number of national church leaders, including Bishop Rob, our new Bishop of Penrith, and Anthony Boateng, currently Vice President of the Methodist conference. It referred to the cost of living crisis and said "there is ample evidence to show that while poorer and ordinary people struggle, the wealthiest among the population have prospered during the Covid crisis. Wealth inequality already embedded in the UK prior to the pandemic has increased considerably."

The church leaders went on to say that rising inequality is shown to be damaging for both rich and poor alike, being linked to economic instability, rising crime levels and increased burdens on the health and social care systems. They called for those whose income was derived from work, including key workers whose contribution during the Covid pandemic had been widely recognised, to be protected from rising costs. As Christians they believed that urgent action was needed to protect the well-being of all in society especially the most vulnerable, and that those best able to do so should make a fair contribution. Using the story of Jesus and Zacchaeus in Luke's Gospel as an example, they called for bold and compassionate action to reform the tax system through the introduction of wealth taxes targeted specifically at reducing the scourge of inequality, and hoped to see evidence of this in the 31st of October statement.

I have summarised this statement, as you may have missed it, and there is often criticism that church leaders remain silent in times of national crisis. However the new government decides to lead the nation through the coming winter, it is clear that all ministers face a very difficult situation, and we should continue to pray for them, as well as for the people most affected by rising prices.

Going Green Gracefully No. 23

"The greatest threat to the planet is the belief that someone else will save it" Living a sustainable life is about making a series of choices, but it's also about recognising that some of those choices matter more than others. It is about knowing that eating a vegan lunch with plastic cutlery is better than a beef burger in a compostable container, for example. Or that keeping your old car chugging along for as long as possible is better than buying a brand new Tesla. That picking up a polyester jumper from a charity shop is better than buying a new one made from organic cotton. That leaving your TV plugged in matters far less than whether you take a long-haul flight twice a year.

In particular, recycling is a last resort before sending something to landfill or incineration. It is the last of the four 'Rs' of sustainable living, which, unlike the three 'Rs' of education, are not equally valuable.

They are in order:

Refuse. Don't accept unnecessary packaging. If loose bananas are available, don't buy ones in plastic bags, and write to the Supermarket to ask why some bananas come in bags when it's apparently OK to sell other bananas without. Complain when the café puts an unnecessary straw in your drink, especially if it's plastic.

Reduce. Do you really need so much stuff? Could you repair something rather than replacing it?

Re-use. Could you get that empty plastic bottle refilled with cleaning product? There are books and websites devoted to turning old clothes into new garments. (Are there any jam makers out there who could take empty 1lb jam jars off my hands?)

Recycling. Apart from turning your garden waste into compost at home, all recycling involves using energy for transport and processing. There are doubts about how much plastic actually gets recycled. But if something no longer has a place in your house, see if some or all of it can be recycled.

The Bishops of Carlisle and Penrith are currently touring the county explaining more about God for All - Cumbria's Ecumenical Vision and Strategy and how it might be reflected in a flourishing church. The four key themes of Follow Daily, Care. Deeply, Speak Boldly and Tread Gently are simple, direct, straightforward and, hopefully, memorable. The Diocese have ensured that a realistic assessment of our current position is recognised as many churches face falling attendances, financial pressures and fatigued church leaders all at a time when everyone is being affected by the current cost of living crisis. In many circumstances this backdrop would be at best disheartening but we have hope, hope in Jesus and our bountiful God which enables us to be bold and courageous in our faith as we seek to put words into action and make the strategy a reality.

The Diocese is committed to providing support across seven areas to churches and mission communities.

Ministry: helping discern and release the ministry churches need, both in terms of people and gifts

Buildings: helping plan the future of our physical presence in local communities and think through how buildings can be sustainable servants of our communities

Growing younger: helping the Church to engage more effectively with young people

Church planting and pioneering: exploring a range of approaches to reach out to those who do not currently engage with Church

Eco: helping achieve our environment goals e.g. the Church of England's target for becoming Net Carbon Zero by 2030

Schools: supporting our local schools, particularly (but not exclusively) the Church schools family, in line with the Church in Cumbria's Vision for Education 2018 to promote Jesus' promise of "life in all its fullness"

Digital: helping the Church to engage more effectively in the digital environment

Without meaningful engagement and connection with the parish community, the services offered are unlikely to be fully effective as we seek to take our faith out from the church whilst continuing to invite all into the church.

Where do you think your parish churches could do more, could be more effective?

Perhaps thinking of the seven key areas above in conjunction with the four key themes of God for All might stimulate your thoughts and give rise to ideas that can be explored further. Report on October Meeting of The Gather Gardening Group

On Wednesday 12th October Dr Sarah Richards, also a member, invited us to Hawes Farm, Ennerdale to learn more about environmentally friendly composting and making our own from garden waste along with torn up paper, cardboard and crushed eggshells. Sarah's husband has built three enclosed areas for starting and moving on compost with the third holding the finished product. She expressed the importance of warmth and aerating to keep the compost working and has recently made lids to keep in the warmth and limit the rain which can leech out the nutrients.



Sarah is also experimenting with a plastic composter using food waste along with uncrushed egg boxes and paper waste, placing the bin in a shed for extra warmth. She expressed the need of some starter compost incorporating worms but also the necessity for warmth and air to get the necessary reaction started and has purchased an aerating compost mixing tool, which has attached wings which open up on the return prodding leaving an air tunnel. The group agreed with Sarah that adding compostable bags was unsuccessful.

The Gather are presently tidying part of the garden alongside No 1 Forestry Cottage and after adding some top soil the Garden Group have been invited by Julie Vickers (the

initial scone maker for The Gather who has now retired to Cockermouth) to dig out any ground cover plants from her former garden at Mireside, Ennerdale to help rejuvenate this area. Hoping we have some strong members!!

Future suggestion – to meet again at The Gather upstairs room with a bring and share tea and make Christmas table decorations for the café tables.


