

Minister's Letter

I am currently reading a book by the former governor of the Bank of England, *Mark Carney*. It is called *Values*. The first few chapters are quite heavy going for someone like me who has never studied economics in an academic way. He reviews the way thinkers from Aristotle, via Adam Smith, to 20th century economists have struggled to understand the nature of money, and the way in which it gives value to objects, commodities and transactions.

I have not yet finished the book, but his argument seems to be that economic systems are neither autonomous, nor inevitable, but a product of the organisation of society, and the values that it holds. The task of the professional economist should not be to dictate to people how the economy should be run, but rather to use economic expertise in order to enable nations to achieve their non-financial aspiration.

Economics, like science and technology, needs to serve the wider values of society. Evidence seems to suggest that where inequalities are least, then happiness is also more widely distributed and deeply experienced. This then raises the question about where the values which inform scientific advancement and economic progress should come from. I put this alongside a recent report that fewer than half of people surveyed in Britain now find God to be important to their life. But everyone has to believe in something, even if it is only their own selfish desires.

Mark Carney cites with approval the view that, while "the greatest happiness of the greatest number" might be a good standard for evaluating policy, it is quite wrong to equate happiness with economic prosperity. There are all kinds of things from the cleanliness of the air to the quality of our relationships that don't depend on money. Even more important is to remember that seeking the widest degree of happiness requires considerable altruism. This is best summed up by what has come to be known as the golden rule: "Do as you would be done by." We find this in the teaching of most major religions, including Christianity.

Perhaps, by next month, I will have finished the book, and will be able to share with you Mark Carney's observations on the Covid pandemic and the climate crisis.

Did you know that eating fruit and vegetables when they're in season means that they are at their best, nutritionally-speaking? Following the completion of the flood damage caused by the recent burst mains water supply to St. Mary's Ennerdale Church Community Room, the room is now "open for business" again.

The Room is used regularly by members of the local community as their local Polling Booth, as a venue for holding various forms of social group meetings, coffee mornings and/or afternoon meetings, for craft groups, meetings of the Horticultural Show Society, the Kinniside Graziers Society, for council meetings, school lessons, etc.

At its AGM on Wednesday 26th April 2023, the Community Room Committee agreed that, going forward, it would **not** increase its hourly charge for the hire of the room for the current financial year 2023/2024. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. Jeremiah 29: 7

Modern slavery is a crime in Britain that involves the exploitation of people for personal or commercial gain. It can take many forms, including human trafficking, forced labour, and debt bondage. When people are rescued from modern slavery, they are often deeply traumatised and have multiple needs for support. Support is generally offered by the **Salvation Army**, whose expertise in this specialised area is widely recognised, but paid for by the government.

Jo Phillips, who works for all the churches in Cumbria as Social Responsibility Officer, takes a particular interest in modern slavery. She has recently raised concerns about changes to the status of victims of modern slavery in the Illegal Migration Bill currently going through Parliament. Very often, victims have been 'trafficked' – brought into this country to be exploited in some way – and usually that means they are illegal migrants. Currently, potential victims are protected from removal from this country and supported while their circumstances are investigated, and Home Office figures show that 90% of those referred are ultimately recognised as victims. If they are in fear of returning to their country of origin (often that is where the traffickers are based) they are entitled to asylum here. The Bill will remove this protection and support, leading to their immediate removal.

In her article in the **Churches Together in Cumbria Newsletter,** Jo highlights widespread opposition to these proposals from within the church. A statement signed by more than 1450 church leaders opposing the government's Illegal Migration Bill has been handed to 10 Downing Street, saying that the government's proposals are "incompatible with our Christian conviction that all human beings are made in the image of God". She also quotes a statement from the Evangelical Alliance to the same effect.
