Minister's Letter

I am concerned that the concept of truth is being devalued in modern society. We often hear people say things like "that may be your truth, but it isn't my truth." Now there are some areas where comments like this are perfectly legitimate. I will tell you I know for a fact that God exists; otherwise I would not be ordained and I certainly wouldn't be living in Cumbria. That is my truth. But it is perfectly logical for someone else who has had no experiences of a religious nature to say that they have no concept of God. That is their truth.

But many other things are unquestionably true, based on irrefutable scientific or historical evidence. There is no question about the result of the most recent American presidential election. Very many legal cases attempting to challenge aspects of the election were all thrown out for lack of evidence. Yet a substantial minority of the American people believe that the election was "stolen." The numbers are a lot smaller, but there are people on this side of the Atlantic, who believe that the Covid vaccinations were an attempt by the government to control the population by implanting a microchip in everyone's body.

These conspiracy theories would be relatively harmless if only a few cranks accepted them. However, these days, many younger people do not get their picture of the world from trusted sources, like the BBC or a reputable newspaper. Instead it comes from their phones via social media. The algorithms which drive social media are designed to show people things they are interested in. In one respect that is helpful, so that I don't get shown lots of pictures of adorable kittens, when what I am interested in is the gossip around my football team. But in the case of news it divides the population into groups who only read stories which support their prejudices. Unlike traditional media, the Internet makes no distinction between actual news, and fairy stories masquerading as truth.

We are rightly contemptuous of totalitarian governments which attempt to maintain the support of the population by controlling the news they receive. But democratic states are at risk of being divided by this relative view of truth into mutually antagonistic groups, whose distorted views of reality make them unable to have any kind of dialogue.

Clearly, in a democracy, there is room for a variety of views on how situations such as pandemic or war in Europe should be evaluated and dealt with. But there cannot be a healthy dialogue between these views, unless there is an agreed basis of the facts from which the various points of view begin.

Decades ago, when the Internet was only used by a handful of geeks, the futurologist Alvin Toffler predicted that the schools of the future would not only have to teach children how to read and write, but also, how to evaluate information from the media. He called it media-literacy. This is one of his predictions which has come true with a vengeance; I hope schools have taken note.

The Bible

A short article from Mary Johnson:

I felt I would write about the Bible this month given that the contact is associated with the three churches in the parishes of Lamplugh, Ennerdale and Kirkland.

The bible is not one book but many in fact it is a whole library of books. The word *biblia* in Latin and Greek is plural (books). There are not just many books but many kinds of books such as history, law, poetry, letters and songs.

We ask, What kind of book is this and when was it written? Who wrote it, who was it written for and above all why was it written?

To answer that question will provide the key to unlock its message. Nothing in the bible can be fully understood unless seen as part of the whole. The context in which it is written is not just in a chapter, paragraph or a section. The books were by 40 different authors over 1,400 years. God gave us a library of different types of literature in three languages mainly Greek and Hebrew with a little Aramaic. The bible reflects the personalities and perspectives of the different authors just as any two books in a public library.

God did not treat the authors as word processors but through his spirit communicated his truth so was the ultimate author.

Of interest to everyone who loves walking or cycling or running along the trails from Bowness Knott, Forestry England have recently introduced car parking charges for all users of the car park there. There is now a payment machine in place that accepts **card payment only** (no cash).

Up to 1 hour	£2.00	Up to 2 hours	£3.50
Up to 4 hours	£5.00	All day	£8.00

These charges also apply to Blue Badge holders. There are no accessible parking spaces.

The car park at Bleach Green remains free at the time of writing.

GOING GREEN GRACEFULLY No. 30

Water, Water Everywhere?



Here we are, on the western edge of the Lake District, England's premier National Park, and we're not short of water here (mind you, I'm writing this during a dry spell that's lasted over three weeks, so it's looking a tad dry out there!) But you'll know only too well what an incredibly precious resource water is and how all life depends on it.

Our changing world means that previously productive areas are turning to desert, with the consequent migration of the people who lived there to areas that are less arid. It's predicted that future wars will increasingly be fought over water and who controls this vital resource. So, here in Cumbria – we're fortunate in having an abundance of the precious liquid!

Mind you, there's always a lot of chat about how it's managed; for example, Lake Windermere has recently been in the news regarding the number of times that United Utilities have dumped sewage effluent into its clean waters. Apparently, last year, UU discharged sewage into the lake on 246 days (that's over two-thirds of the year). Not surprisingly, this has led to a deal of protest.

UU claims to be spending many £millions to deal with the problem. However, whilst we rightly expect our water company to be managing its resources in as effective a way as possible, it surely behoves us, as water-users, to be equally prudent in the way in which we use (and waste) water – after all, if we, as a community, are releasing quantities of 'used' water that UU have to treat, then by minimising this impact, we can have a positive effect upon our environment.

I'm sure that readers are already fully conversant with water conservation methods such as not running the tap while you brush your teeth, having a shorter shower (rather than a bath), and so on. However, how about taking a shower, say, three times a week, rather than every day? Make sure that the dishwasher or washing machine is full, before using it. Fill the kettle with just the amount of water for your cuppa (saves leccy too!). In this hot weather, keep a jug of water in the fridge (as opposed to running the tap until it's cold). And finally – even consider flushing the toilet less frequently: a notice on the compost loo at a place we stayed suggested, "If it's yellow, let it mellow. If it's brown, flush it down"! Over to you...!

Ennerdale and Kinniside Parish Council aim to meet on the third Tuesday of every second month. The meeting date, location and agenda will be published on the website prior to each meeting.

Parishioners of Ennerdale and Kinniside are very welcome to attend these meetings. If you wish for a matter to be brought to the council's attention or for a topic to be added to the agenda then please contact our Clerk, Jane Coltman, using the contact details below. Jane will advise on the best way to get your topic added to the agenda. Note - items to be added to the agenda must be notified to the clerk at least three days prior to a meeting taking place.

One important aspect of the Parish Council's work is, as a statutory consultee on planning matters, to review and report back to the relevant local planning authorities on any new planning applications in this area. Ideally, to give the council enough time to be notified about and to consider new applications, it would be most beneficial for us to be notified at least two weeks prior to a meeting.

Parishioners and members of the public can apply to speak on a specific agenda item (e.g. a planning application) at the Parish Council meeting. There is a time limit of 3 minutes given to speakers to put a case forward on an agenda item.

Parish Council working with Wild Ennerdale:

One of the topics on the last agenda related to the community's engagement with Wild Ennerdale. The minutes state that representatives from Wild Ennerdale aim to attend future Parish Council meetings, which is great news!

Ennerdale and Kirkland Parish Council were recently contacted by the good folk at Hyperfast GB as part of an awareness campaign about gigabit-capable broadband being brought to rural communities. This is an informational piece, not an advertisement, because people can purchase nothing from Hyperfast GB.



Project Gigabit is the government's flagship £5 billion programme to enable hard-to-reach communities around the UK to access *lightning-fast gigabit-capable broadband*. The fast, reliable connections delivered by Project Gigabit will level-up mostly rural and remote communities across the UK. The UK government is working with suppliers and communities to ensure that people can access fast and reliable digital connectivity that can transform their lives.

A £108m broadband improvement contract to provide these services to Cumbria was recently awarded to Northern Ireland-based company Fibrus, who's wholesale division, **Hyperfast GB**, have been tasked with bringing next generation broadband services to up to 60,000 homes and businesses that might have otherwise missed out on gigabit upgrades.

Cumbria County Council are working collaboratively with **Hyperfast GB** on ensuring that the network build commences as quickly as possible, once the they have completed their detailed plans for this build. An amount of preparatory work is required to reach premises (for example, digging trenches, laying duct, installing fibre) prior to being able to access a service. This varies depending on geography and supplier. The first premises under this contract are anticipated to have access to gigabit-capable broadband in 2023. Once the gigabit-capable network has been built, residents and businesses will be able to request a connection from a broadband service provider to benefit from the faster speeds.

FOLLOW DAILY We will help each other to follow Jesus more closely, seeking to grow as his disciples in all aspects of life, both corporately and as individuals

Preaching on Sundays focuses regularly on discipleship. We aim to provide appropriate instruction for those approaching us for baptism and confirmation. We offer an enquirers course and will investigate appropriate ways of encouraging bible study.

CARE DEEPLY We will listen to our local communities, and respond in loving service, seeking to transform injustice, challenge oppression and pursue peace & reconciliation

We provide pastoral care for those whose bereavement or illness is made known to us. We are committed to making all our buildings dementia friendly, and promoting disability and dementia awareness among the congregation. We have a welcome letter for new arrivals in the parish. Two of our buildings are open daily providing quiet spaces for reflection and prayer. Kirkland is used for training by First Responders. We affirm the loving service offered informally by church members in a variety of settings. We support the local Food Bank at harvest time. We support Christian Aid both during Christian Aid week and through the Bishop's Harvest Appeal. We support Action for Children and the Children's Society. We give members of the congregation the opportunity to participate in campaigns initiated by Christian Aid. Social Responsibility issues are discussed from time to time in Contact and at Café Church.





### Listening to our communities

SPEAK BOLDLY We will share our faith in Jesus Christ in everyday ways, seeking to connect with everyone, especially those currently unrepresented in our churches. We'll do this in both time-honoured & pioneering ways.

> We do this directly through the liturgy and preaching in our traditional worship, and through taking school assemblies and presenting Bibles to school leavers. We do this less directly through Contact and our 'Fresh Expressions': First Tuesday, Café Church and Messy Church. In 2023 we will again have a presence at Ennerdale Show. It is also important that we demonstrate God's love in the way we respond to everyone who comes into contact with the church. We support mission initiatives originating in our Mission Community.

TREAD GENTLY We will strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, seeking to sustain and renew the life of the earth

> We are following the Eco church programme, initially at Kirkland, which encompasses many activities directed to this end: including reviewing our buildings, the land around them, our teaching ministry, and engaging with local people via our church magazine.


